Trinity Sunday

The faith of Christians is rooted in the mystery of the Trinity. God is the creator and Father of all; God is also the Son who came among us to save humanity from its failings; today, God is with us as the Holy Spirit, who brings us into the mystery of God's presence.

First Reading: Moses tells the people that God has been revealed to them and by keeping the Lord's commandments they will honour his name and be at right relationships with each other.

Psalm 32 - A song that praises the majesty of God.

Second Reading: The Holy Spirit places us in the same relationship that Jesus had with the Father; With Christ we can say to God, "Abba, Father."

Gospel: Most (though not all) of the disciples give to Jesus the same worship that is due to God. Jesus commissions his disciples to go and make disciples of all the nations.
