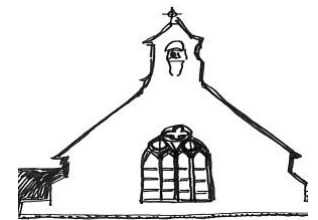


Parish of Killavullen and Annakisha

Feast of Corpus Christi

Christ is with us today in the sacrament of his Body and Blood. At Mass we celebrate his real presence under the sacramental signs of bread and wine.
First Reading: Moses seals the covenant with a ritual that had to be constantly repeated. For Christians, Jesus is the Lamb of God whose sacrifice was made once and for all.

Psalm 115 - Our gathering is to give thanks to God for all our blessings.

Second Reading: Jesus established a new Covenant. He brings us into God's presence and the promise of God's love.

Gospel: Jesus celebrated the Passover Meal with his followers on the eve of his death. He changed the meaning of the meal, identifying himself with the Lamb of sacrifice. Whenever we celebrate Mass we remember his love for us and celebrate our communion with him and one another.

One Hour for Peace: To mark today's feastday of The Body and Blood of Christ, a Holy Hour will take Place before the Blessed Sacrament this Sunday evening (June 2) from 7.00-8.00pm.

We will pray especially for the intention of peace in the world today, mindful of the ongoing tragedy in the Gaza Strip. Pope Francis revealed in a CBS *60 Minutes* interview this week, that at 7.00pm each day he telephones the Gaza Strip's only Catholic Church, where 600 Palestinians have taken refuge in recent months. Each evening, he listens to the stories of human suffering in the area. The eight month old conflict between Hamas and Israel has claimed the lives of almost 40,000 people, most of them ordinary civilians at the hands of the Israeli Defence Forces. May our prayer for peace join those of many others around the world.
