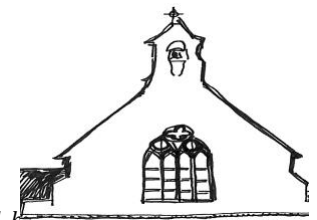


Parish of Killavullen and Annakisha

Tenth Sunday – The Lord, the giver of life.

Faith Camp / Day Trip: A great day was had by all who attended the children’s & alterservers’ Faith Camp last Friday. We departed Killavullen Church gates and arrived at St Joseph’s Carmelite Monastery, Tallow at 11.00am for Mass in the beautiful chapel, with its large stained glass window depicting Mount Carmel, in Palestine and the long journey of ascent that is the spiritual life.



Afterwards the sisters shared the story of their daily lives, including the two hours they spend in prayer each day. The community at Tallow includes sisters from India, East Timor and the Philippines. Afterwards we made our way to Ardmore for lunch and then embarked on the cliff walk, stopping at the medieval Cathedral from the tenth century, with its depictions of scenes from the Bible, and the 30m tall Round Tower, which is the best preserved of its kind in Ireland. We blessed ourselves at Saint Declan’s Well and held a meeting with prayers at Ardmore Parish Church. We learnt much from our day trip, including the lifestory of Saint Declan who brought the Christian faith to Ireland before the arrival of Saint Patrick in 432AD.
