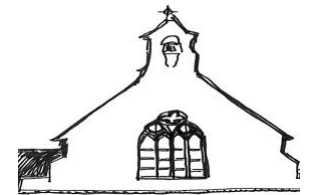


Parish of Killavullen and Annakisha

Twenty Second Sunday – Worship the Lord from your heart.

First Reading: Keeping the laws of the Lord is the wise and prudent path in life. Whenever the people of Israel truly followed the *Torah* (Law) in it's spirit as well as in its letter, they were widely admired.

Psalms 14 – Act with justice, speak the truth, be generous and cast no slur on your neighbour.

Second Reading: The apostle James sees Christianity as part of the new creation that began with the resurrection of Jesus: we become part of that new creation by listening to the Word of God and making it part of our lives.

Gospel: Jesus criticises the Pharisees and religious scribes (the religious leaders of his time) for observing the letter of the religious law (the *Torah*) while neglecting its substance.

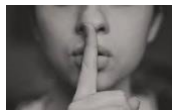
