Twenty Fifth Sunday: *Christ destined to suffer for our salvation.*

First Reading: It is neither profitable nor popular to always be virtuous. It is difficult to keep on trusting in God's ways, because the world has values and standards which value our own self-determination rather than God's.

Psalm 53 – The Lord upholds those who trust in him.

Second Reading: The wisdom that "comes down from on high" brings peace to humanity. Following our own desires leads to conflict and disharmony. Gospel: Jesus begins the journey towards Jerusalem, conscious that God's Kingdom would be brought about through the laying down of his life. Annuario Parochialis / The Parish Yearbook maintained by Parish Priests down through the years has recently been retrieved from the old parochial house, to record key events in the life of the parish. Here are further extracts: "1969: Canon O'Neill PP, died on the 1st December 1969. He was Parish Priest of Killavullen for 18 years.

1970: Fr D. Ryan was appointed Parish Priest in July.

Clenor School was closed in April and the children are being transported to Killavullen NS. The last principal in Clenor was Michael Duggan; the last assistant in Clenor was Mrs Ahern. Both took up appointments in Mallow. Mrs Ahern is the sister of Mrs P O'Brien, former Principal of Ballygown. The alteration of the Sanctuary in Killavullen (GC: *this was to comply with the Vatican II reforms*) was completed in time for Confirmations on April 19. Later in the year it was redecorated and central heating was installed.

Ballygown NS was redecorated during the Summer by D. Murphy, Ballincollig. The carpet was laid by Carpet Centre, Cork at £246."
