As Part of the Preparations for the Jubilee Year 2025, Pope Francis is calling on Catholics to participate in World Rosary Day, on 7 October, the Feast of the Holy Rosary. At 7.00pm in Rome, Archbishop Rolandas Makrickas will lead the *Rosary* at the Basilica of Saint Mary Major. Here, the Bishops of Ireland are inviting all individuals, parishes, groups and families to pray the *Rosary* at 7pm this Monday. In a special way they invite parents and grandparents to use this opportunity to share the gift and grace of the *Rosary* with children and young people. We will celebrate the Rosary in Killavullen Church at 7.00pm on Monday (October 7). Pope Francis is asking that we gather in prayer, trusting in the intercession of Our Lady to accompany us on the journey toward hope, renewal, and grace as we prepare for the Jubilee Year 2025.

The Children's Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Masses will recommence over the coming weeks. Please contact Reena O'Sullivan or Fr Gerard if you would like to be involved as an adult leader. The aim of this initiative is to make Sunday Mass child and family friendly. Children will have the option of hearing the word of God (the Liturgy of the Word at Mass) among themselves (in the church meeting room) and explained by capable adults, before rejoining their families for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.
