Thirty First Sunday *The Lord rescues us from all our distress*
1st Reading: Respect for the Lord our God involves keeping his commandments. Observing them brings many blessings, including peace and goodwill. This reading includes one of the key verses of Judaism: “Shema Israel ... hear O Israel....” *Listen for the voice of God.*
Responsorial Psalm: God’s presence is the foundation of our lives.
2nd Reading: The Son of God was able to sympathise fully with the human experience; he brings us into God’s presence.
Gospel: There were 613 commandments and religious observances in the Jewish Law (the Torah): Jesus sums them up as the love of God and love of neighbour. Attending Sunday Mass, shows our respect for both commandments.
