### **N73 Roadworks at Annakisha Church / Walk for Peace in the Holy Land and Lebanon in Support of the Humanitarian Relief Effort of Trócaire:**

The roadworks at Annakisha are nearing completion and include a rebuilding of the car-park surface, a new church access road, a new perimeter wall and railing and a seating area at the Tom Barry Monument. The development will greatly enhance the surrounds of Annakisha Church for both visitors and parishioners alike. We thank Cork County Council and Sorensen Civil Engineering for their dedicated work in improving the N73 in our area.

**The roadworks over the past year have coincided with the conflict in the Holy Land and now Lebanon. Next Sunday (November 24)** a walk for peace will take place from Annakisha Church along the new (southbound) section of the N73 (about 2.2km from and returning to the church), or on the adjoining cycle/pedestrian paths if it has opened for traffic. Representatives from Trócaire will lead a *Prayer Service for Peace at 2.30pm, inside the church.* This will be followed by the walk (at 3.00pm) to show our solidarity with the victims of violence in the Middle East, be they Jewish, Muslim or Christian. A collection will be made for Trócaire’s humanitarian relief effort in the region.
