Jimmy Carter (1924-2024), who died last week, served as president of the United States from 1976-1980. His term in office was marred by the energy (oil) crisis in 1976 and a revolution in Iran that marked the beginning of Islamic fundamentalism worldwide. A practicing Christian, he allowed his faith to influence his policies, as was evident in his televised speech of July 15, 1979. His description of Western society holds true to this day ...

"Our people are losing that faith, not only in government itself but in the ability as citizens to serve as the ultimate rulers and shapers of our democracy. As a people we know our past and we are proud of it. Our progress has been part of the living history of America, even the world. We always believed that we were part of a great movement of humanity itself called democracy, involved in the search for freedom, and that belief has always strengthened us in our purpose. But just as we are losing our confidence in the future, we are also beginning to close the door on our past.

In a nation that was proud of hard work, strong families, close-knit communities, and our faith in God, too many of us now tend to worship selfindulgence and consumption. Human identity is no longer defined by what one does, but by what one owns. But we've discovered that owning things and consuming things does not satisfy our longing for meaning. We've learned that piling up material goods cannot fill the emptiness of lives which have no confidence or purpose."
